None of these foundations is listed. with "foundation directory" Next, second pass, comes from front foundation, that makes

a "contribution" to a prominent foundation known for its charitable and education organizations.

Third pass comes when legitimate organizations make contribution to CIA DESIGNATED RECIFINET CREQNIZATION.

"Never had the Central Intelligence Agency's inner workings seemed quite so painfully visible, fight down to their very foundations. For fifteen hears the agency has been convertly funneling money through a mze of philanthropic funds to maintain students, tecahers, scholars, CHURCHMEN, JURISTS, union organizers.

"The techniqued seemed surprisingly simple. the CIA;s pet tactic was a"three layer pass through" operation for getting money from its own doffers into the hands of favored philanthropies, some knowing and some apparently not.

"First, the agency set up a score of dummy foundations, (like Price, Gotham, or Beacon), mailing adresses and mysteriously self replenishing bank accounts. THESE FRONTS SHOW UP NEITHER IN STANDARD FOUNDATION DIRECTORIES NOR IN THE FILES OF THE INTERANL REVENUE

"For the "Pass through" the CIA adoped 30 of the 15,000 authentic roundations operating in the U.S. and made them CONDUITS TO THE RECIPIENT GROUPS. "We were approached about three years ago by a representative of the CIA," said Willaim P. HOBBY JR, PRESIDENT OF THE HOUSTON POST AND TRUSTEE OF THE HOBBY FOUNDATION." WE WERE TOLD THAT IF WE COOPERATED, WE WOULD RECEIVE CERTAIN FHNDS FROM THE CIA. MOST SIMPLY THOUGHT ANSWERED A CALL TO PATRIOTIC DUTY"
