Jack Hood Vaughn, director of the Peace Corps, says there are t no spies in the Peace Corps, v contrary to Communist propa-I ganda agencies which insist ( there are,

"As far as I know," Vaughn said yesterday, "the Peace Corps is the only federal agency that from the beginning has taken the position . . . that there will be no involvement of any kind with intelligence agencies."

He appeared on Metromedia's "Opinion: Washington."

Vaughn said it is a Peace Corps rule that fromer volunteers may not join a U.S. intelligence agency until they have been out of the Peace Corps for five years or more. Nor may a volunteer be assigned to military intelligence if he is drafted, Vaughn said.
