In Gallup Poll surveys conducted during the last five months, since September, the President's approval score has not gone above 48 per cent nor below 44 per cent.

The latest over-all approval rating is the same as September's, 46 per cent, but in the five-month period between these two surveys, a reduction has taken place in the propor-tions who "strongly approve" and "strongly disapprove." This is revealed in the results of a second survey question:

"How strongly do you approve (or disapprove) - very strongly or not so strongly?"

The results of this second question show that approxi-mately one person in six "strongly approves" of the way
