**Columbia U.
Won't Bar CIA
Recruiting**

NEW YORK, Nov. 21 (AP) — President Grayson Kirk of Columbia University declared today that the school will continue to allow the Central Intelligence Agency and all prospective employers to interview students on the campus.

Kirk addressed 500 students who had gathered in response to a Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) demand that Columbia bar the CIA.

Kirk said Columbia does not invite the employers, nor urge students to see them. He said students were merely considering job opportunities.

At a rally before Kirk's address, John Fuerst, a Columbia senior, compared the CIA to narcotics pushers. He said both are engaged in illegal activity.

The National president of the SDS, Nicholas Eggelson, addressed the outside rally and said that the "activity" at Columbia was "only the beginning of a demonstration to show people can think. We are seeing here at Columbia the process, as I have seen it all over the country."

The CIA had been scheduled to interview students at Columbia last Monday, but discontinued interviewing after 300 students held a demonstration protest.
