

Senate Given Plans To Oversee CIA Actions

Two proposals designed to subject the Central Intelligence Agency to closer congressional scrutiny were offered in the Senate yesterday.

Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy (D-Minn.) called for creation of a special Senate foreign relations subcommittee to make a "full and complete study" of the effects of CIA operations on foreign relations of the United States.

Sen. Stephen M. Young (D-Ohio) introduced a proposal which would establish a joint Senate-House committee, on a permanent basis, to oversee CIA operations.

Both senators, in floor statements accompanying their proposals, said CIA has been making policy as well as carrying it out.
