Reflecting on the assassination of Richard Welch, C.I.A. chief of station in Athens, one cannot but be amazed at the carelessness of our "supersecret" spy agency. Less than a year ago while this writer was working on contract with the U. S. A. I. D. mission in Peru, Mr. Welch's cover was blown in a front-page story in one of the Lima daily newspapers. Although in the incestuous U. S. diplomatic communities around the world it is usually common knowledge who the C.I.A. officers are, public revelation of such should occasion fairly prompt reposting to Washington, Instead, Mr. Welch, several months after being publicly identified in Peru, was transferred directly to Athens, holding the same transparent title he had held in Lima, special assistant to the Ambassador.
