**Italian Paper Says
50 Got CIA Funds**

TURIN, Italy, Feb. 26 (UPI)—The newspaper La Stampa said today a controversial Italian intelligence chief had admitted that he paid off 50 Italian politicians with money given him by former U.S. Ambassador Graham A. Martin.

When Martin's successor cut off the funding, the intelligence chief, Gen. Vito Miceli appealed to the CIA for additional money but did not get it, La Stampa said.

The newspaper, in a Washington-dated story, said its latest information came from the final unpublished pages of Rep. Otis Pike's committee report regarding CIA activities in Italy.
