Dear Jerry,

For when you return and have time:

A nice lady of the right, a Mrs. Leonard who once owned a local radio station, has ought me out to report that a friend of hers, now dead, with former CIA connections, had had either suspicions or evidence of CIA involvement in the JFK assassination. The man who was her friend was named Herman "insey. I presume he also was of the right.

She also told me that he had made a deposit of his material with a lawyer whose name she could not recall. Then she phoned to identify the lawyer as Henry Rothblatt of NYC. She suggested that I get in touch with him.

Not only do I not have a NYC phone book, but I think this would better be handled verbally, in part because Rothblatt may have complicated responsibilities that may preclude his saying anything about this. If he is the man I recall, he handling of the interests of his clients against whom there were serious charges in Viet Nam was vigorous and in the good tradition of adversary law.
