CIA Accused of Hand In Slaying of Guevara

NEW YORK, March 5 (AP)—Michele Ray, a young French woman journalist, today accused the Central Intelligence Agency of complicity in the slaying last Oct. 9 of Cuban revolutionary Ernesto Che Guevara.

Miss Ray, discussing an article written by her for this month's Ramparts magazine, based the charge on information she said she turned up in seven weeks of research in Bolivia, where Guevara is reported to have been shot to

death by government soldiers. Some of the information, she said, came from Jorge Tarrico, a Bolivian journalist who went to La Higuera; where Guevara is said to have died, after the slaying. Tarrico later fled to Paris.

In the article, Miss Ray names two men—Felix Ramos, 26, and Eduardo Gonzales, 32—who she says are “Cubans and members of the CIA counterinsurgency team composed of Cuban exiles operating out of Panama.”
