NOTES (General):

This list covers CD's from the CIA only. CD 1159 is a copy of the Eisenberg book discussed in CD 1096, provided by the CIA. CD 1345 is a memo from Dulles, and not a CIA document (but CIA Item 777-336A appears to be on the same subject.) CD 597 and CD 1544 relate to a foreign matter which is also discussed in some CIA items, but these CD's came to the Warren Commission from the FBI, not the CIA.

There is quite a bit of non-CD material which was given to the Warren Commission in the CIA file. That is, the CD list is not complete as a description of information provided by the CIA.

I have not actually checked all the CIA items to confirm that they are in fact the indicated CD's. I would like to know about any errors.

In some cases, attachments which are included in the CD were given different CIA item numbers, and are not listed here.

The page count is taken from the CIA's Document Disposition Index. In a few cases, where a page count for the CD in the Archives was readily available, and it differed, it is given in parentheses.

The date given is also from the CIA's Document Disposition Index. Sometimes a different date appears on the Warren Commission's CD list.

Most of the CD's have been released with deletions. In many cases, only things like internal CIA filing instructions have been deleted; the Document Disposition Index specifies the nature of the deletions for each item. In general, the substance of each partly deleted item is clear.

NOTES (on specific CD's):

CD 321: It is not clear to me what the Archives' 230 pages here are, and I don't seem to have a CIA item corresponding to CD 321, but I expect that in CD 818 (a revised version of CD 321), together with CD's 361, 680, and 691 (the appendices to CD 321), I have all the information from CD 321.

CD 692: CIA item 509-522 is the cover letter; items 591-252A through 599-252I are the CIA-originated items in CD 692, the Oswald pre-assassination file. The Document Disposition Index lists 22 such additional pages. The CD at the Archives, which was released some time ago, totals about 116 pages, largely FBI reports.

NOTES ON FULLY WITHHELD CD'S:

CD 347 is described in the CD list as a Secret memo of 31 Jan 64, "Information developed by CIA on the activity of Lee Harvey Oswald in Mexico City, 28 September - 3 October 1963 w/att photograph of Valeriy Vladimirovich Kostikov." The CIA's Index admits that "most of the substantive information in this document is available in other [,] unclassified documents." (That fact was the basis for my separate FOIA request for this item; see my letter of 10 July 75 to the CIA.) The CIA states that the substantive information "is inextricably mixed with operational details which, if exposed, would compromise several sensitive foreign intelligence sources, as well as a sensitive foreign intelligence operational method." This presumably refers to taps and photographs in Mexico. This claim has been made despite the fact that CIA item 498-204 states that the information in this report to the Warren Commission would be "presented so as to protect your [Mexican] sources and techniques." I am confident that CD 347 would show that the CIA did not give the Commission a timely and accurate report on the photos of the mystery man in Mexico.

CD 698 is a Helms memo of 31 Mar 64, "re 'Reports on Activities and Travel of Lee Harvey Oswald and Marina Nikolevna Oswald' w/attachments A, B, C, D, and E." It is withheld because of agreements with foreign intelligence services; the CIA does not want to confirm those liaison arrangements.

CD 902 is a Secret Helms memo of 6 May 64, entitled "Criteria for dissemination of information to the Secret Service; Recommendations of CIA relative to Presidential protection." The CIA Index specifies that a sanitized version, item 904-394, is available. (See CE 1356)

CD 1551 is a Top Secret Helms memo to Rankin, dated 22 May 64, "w attached report of conversations between Cuban President and Cuban Ambassador." I haven't found it in the CIA's Document Disposition Index.
