

Security Chief In Manila Gets CIA Reports

MANILA, (AP)—The Chief of the Philippine National Intelligence Coordinating Agency told a senate hearing today that six American agents of the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency report to him regularly.

Gen. Ismael Lapuz also said it was possible other CIA agents operate in the Philippines without his knowledge.

The hearing was called following a report by a Manila Times columnist that the CIA is rumored planning to build up Sen. Genaro Magsaysay as a presidential candidate this year to oppose President Ferdinand E. Marcos.

Lapuz said the report was "unsubstantiated." Magsaysay has denied it.
