

Judge to Rule On Oswald Tape

NEW YORK, Jan. 3 (UPI). — The sale of a recorded interview with Lee Harvey Oswald made three months before he assassinated President John F. Kennedy was blocked Tuesday pending a court decision on who owns the original tape.

The long playing record was to have been released for sale to the public Tuesday but State Supreme Court Justice Samuel H. Hofstadter continued a stay sought by the Information Council of America.

The council, a nonprofit organization based in New Orleans, alleged it bought the original tape from William K. Stuckey, of Evanston, Ill., for \$6500 on Oct. 21, 1964. Stuckey, then a New Orleans newspaper reporter and radio commentator, conducted the 40-minute interview Aug. 17, 1963.
