Q: Is it true that the U.S. Information Agency is doing a documentary on Al Capp for distribution overseas? What are they going to do now that Capp has been charged with sodomy, attempted adultery and indecent exposure by that coed in Wisconsin?

A: The USIA has been preparing a documentary on Capp as part of its "One Man" series on various Americans, according to the USIA's Robert Leeper. The "visually exciting documentaries" in the One Man series are displayed in theaters and on television overseas. The documentary on Capp is intended to help show the "impact his life has on millions of others" through his "humor and creativity" in cartooning, says Leeper. It may also touch on his "second career" of personal appearances and lecturing.

As for the charges against Capp, Leeper says, "We must assume that he's innocent . . . If he's found guilty we'll have to reconsider." Other subjects in the "One Man" series: a Los Angeles news vendor, the founder of the D.C. Youth Symphony, a cropdus-
