Dear Mr. Weisberg:


I have received your letter of December 1, 1968, and appreciate hearing from you. You will note from this stationery that I have entered the private practice of law here in Austin since my term of office ran out.

Mr. Weisberg, a very complete record, including correspondence, etc., was kept by my office and made public. Each State supported college in Texas received a complimentary copy for their libraries. A copy was also filed with the State Archives. I do not have a set that can be sent to you.
