When I was in New Orleans in early November, though Ed Devenport of WWL Radio, Dr. Caseriego was willing to talk to me. At that time it was impossible, for by then I was ready to leave. He made several efforts to get in touch with Jim Garrison, which failed.

He had been in charge of the Cuban propaganda broadcasts on WWL. He was then teaching at Cardinal Rummel school (telephone of administrative office ~~821-1650~~, 837-5442).

When I returned to New Orleans in December I attempted to see him. He was reported to be sick, to be going to school for his classes and then going home to bed. He spoke to me just before I left and explained that he had been troubled by a melody that impairs his speech, that when he has it he has to speak very little or he loses his voice entirely.

He expressed a willingness to discuss what he knew at a future date, with me or someone from the DA's office. I suggested that until then he try and recall what and who connected with the various Cuban groups or the matters he broadcast he thought might be pertinent to the investigation.
