Man Tells of JFK Plot

Manila, Philippines—UPI—The Philippine national bureau of investigation reported Friday it has arrested a 24 year old Puerto Rican born American who it said told authorities he took part in an assassination plot against the late President John F. Kennedy.

An NBI investigation report shown to newsmen stated that Luis Angel Castillo had admitted, under influence of truth serum, that he was in Dallas

at the time of the assassination and had been given a rifle by an unidentified man and told to shoot "a man in an open car" during a motorcade.

According to the report, Castillo said there were about 15 other plotters stationed along the motorcade route. He was quoted as saying he was not able to use the rifle because "he heard that somebody else had already shot the man in the open car. . . . He tried to re-

member the man who shot the president and he just knew him as Joe."

The NBI said Castillo was a Cuban trained Communist agent sent to the Philippines to contact Communist Huk guerrillas. He is being held on a charge of illegally entering the Philippines.

Castillo appeared before newsmen at the NBI office Friday and gave evasive and vague answers to most of their questions.
