Kennedy Slaying a 3-Way Plot

(A digest of significant news items that failed to appear in most of the nation's press.)

☆ OPEN AND SHUT CASE
☆ AGAIN. Documentary evidence that Jack Ruby conspired with Lee Harvey Oswald and a third man to murder John F. Kennedy was found two months after the assassination. That was the statement of four Dallas police officers who saw the material. The documents clearly stated that Cuban dictator Fidel Castro ordered Kennedy killed—and that the three "did it for Castro," the officers declared. The crucial evidence was turned over to the FBI, which claims it forwarded the documents to the

Henry Wade confirms that he personally received the evidence from the officers at his home on Jan. 23, 1964. Wade, in turn, handed the documents over to the FBI.

☆ POLL TOLL. During the last week of July a Harris poll showed Democratic contender Jimmy Carter with a massive 68-27 per cent lead over President Ford and a slightly higher percentage over Ronald Reagan, in the popularity for the White House. No poll has been taken since SPOTLIGHT exposed the association of Carter with unsavory elements in the rock music business and drug culture in Georgia (SPOTLIGHT, Aug. 16, 1976).

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LOST, STRAYED OR STOLEN. Government nuclear facilities are unable to account for well over two tons of plutonium and uranium that could be fashioned into scores of atomic bombs. A classified report by the General Accounting Office says that inventory controls of the material were so poor that "timely response and recovery actions are precluded."

☆ SHOT IN THE ARM FOR DOCTOR. Dr. Larry McDonald, the most outspoken conservative Democrat in the Congress, just won his Georgia primary with 54 per cent of the vote in a three way race—a greater margin than when he was first elected in 1974. McDonald's victory was not affected by a lawsuit filed against him last fall after he administered Laetrile to a terminally ill cancer patient who personally requested it. The prosecution hoped that McDonald would settle out of court—featuring adverse publicity; however, McDonald's office said he intends to "fight them all the way."

☆ D.C. CAN'T HOLD CANDLE TO U.N. SCANDAL. The UN is a "smoke pit" of sexual misconduct that makes the recent Washington sex scandal pale by comparison, disgusted UN employees charge. They say both men and women are sexually exploited in the UN hierarchy, which places more value on sex than ability. A former ambassador to the UN says, "There's an urgent need

for a review of the morals and a really thorough housecleaning at the UN."

The national Democratic Club is serving a new drink, the "Cahtah," which is a conventional martini with an olive stuffed with a peanut. Meanwhile, down in Atlanta, fellow-Democrat and former Governor Lester Maddox, who served with Jimmy Carter, is selling a "Jimmy Carter Sandwich" in his new restaurant. It is made with peanut butter and a lot of baloney.

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GRAND DESIGN. On March 29, an editorial in The SPOTLIGHT reported the Reds were intent on gaining control of the Cape sea route, as they are intent on controlling all the world's vital waterways. With disturbances marking the Southern Africa scene, Prime Minister John Vorster says, "It is a fool who didn't see that South Africa, with its control of the Cape sea route, was a prime objective of the communists' grand strategy for world domination."
