OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER - BALTIMORE CITY

I have been employed as a Legal Assistant with the Office of the Public Defender's felony trial division since March 7, 1990. I help Assistant Public Defender's prepare criminal cases for the District Court and the Circuit Court for Baltimore City. I prepare clients' files, interview clients at the jail, prepare investigation requests, file summonses, pre-trial motions and subpoenas, assist at arraignments and trials, maintain the law library, and research and write memoranda on criminal law and procedure, evidence and constitutional law.

SENATE, MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY

During the 1989 legislative session I worked as a Legislative Assistant to Senator Julian Lapides, (D-Baltimore City). I helped Senator Lapides prepare his legislative package, monitored the status of bills, drafted bills and resolutions, coordinated testimony before committees, handled constituent matters, prepared press releases, and updated bill books and files pertaining to legislative matters.

DEPARTMENT OF LAW, CITY OF BALTIMORE

From August until December 1988 I worked as a Legislative Assistant with the Office of Legislative Counsel in the City Solicitor's Office at City Hall. I did legal research and legislative analysis of bills, ordinances and statutes, reviewed schedules for committee hearings in the Maryland General Assembly and Baltimore City Council, and I attended and reported on legislative hearings. In addition, I worked in the Baltimore City Equal Opportunity Compliance Office reviewing contracts and applications for certification of minority and women's business enterprises.

DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE, MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY

From 1986 to 1988 I worked as a Legislative Analyst with the Department of Legislative Reference in Annapolis. I helped the Revisor of Statutes study, clarify and reorganize certain sections of the Annotated Code of Maryland. In addition to working for Code Revision I compiled the changes in each county's Public Local Laws and drafted bills for Delegates and Senators during the legislative session.

CIRCUIT COURT FOR BALTIMORE CITY

From 1984 to 1985 I worked as a Law Clerk to Judge Edward Angeletti at the Circuit Court for Baltimore City. I helped the Judge prepare for civil and criminal trials, including two death penalty cases. I researched and wrote legal memoranda on various civil and criminal issues, coordinated the Judge's trial calendar and maintained the law books and files in the Judge's chambers.

OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR MARYLAND

In 1984 I worked as a Law Clerk in the Consumer Protection Division and later in the Antitrust Division of the Attorney General's Office. I compiled data and evidence, researched and wrote legal memoranda and helped Assistant Attorneys' General prosecute cases.

From 1977 to 1979, prior to law school, I worked as a Law Clerk to then-Assistant Public Defender Edward Angeletti. Judge Angeletti was the senior trial attorney in the felony division at that time. I helped prepare clients' files, interviewed clients at the jail and other department of corrections facilities, filed pre-trial motions, summonses and subpoenas, coordinated the trial calendar, prepared investigation requests and maintained the office.
