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## P R E S S   R E L E A S E

The attached photographs show the discovery of one of the bullets which killed President Kennedy. As will be observed in the third picture showing the clock on top of the book depository, the time of discovery of this bullet was 12:40 p.m. -- ten minutes after President Kennedy was shot.

In Picture No. 1 a man obviously holding official investigative status is being observed by a Dallas police officer and a Dallas deputy sheriff as he leans down to pick up the bullet. Picture No. 2 is an enlargement showing that official's hand reaching for the bullet. The bullet has been identified -- by a comparison study of bullets -- as a .45 caliber, apparently steel jacketed.

In Picture No. 3 the official who has picked up the bullet has become aware of the photographer and has turned his head away, but it can be seen that he is now holding the bullet clenched in his left hand. Our inquiry into the

status of this official picking up the bullet has indicated that he is apparently an investigative agent of the federal government -- employed either by the Federal Bureau of Investigation or the Secret Service. The dark splotches on the ground scattered around the bullet -- which can be seen in all three pictures -- are pieces of matter from President Kennedy's head. Subsequently, a large portion of the President's skull was found near the scene of this picture.

These photographs indicate that within ten minutes after the President was shot law enforcement agencies had obtained custody of one of the bullets which killed the President. These photographs indicate that long before the fraudulent announcement describing Lee Oswald as the lone assassin, the federal government had to know that this large caliber bullet was used in the assassination. Consequently, the federal government had to know that -- inasmuch as it is impossible to fire a .45 caliber bullet from a 6.5 Mannlicher-Carcano -- there had to be a number of individuals firing at the President and that the act was not accomplished by a lone assassin.

This bullet was never introduced into evidence before the Warren Commission. It is not referred to anywhere in the

26 volumes of the Warren Commission testimony and exhibits. This is just another instance of the pattern of deception by the federal government in which evidence has been systematically concealed or destroyed. In this instance, however, the fraudulent activity of federal agencies and officials is here exposed by these photographs.

What this comes down to is that federal agencies and officials knew all along that President Kennedy was not killed by the ancient Italian rifle which they claimed Oswald used. Furthermore, this means that when Oswald was shot by Jack Ruby they had to know that the real assassins of the President were simply getting rid of the patsy so that he could not testify against them -- as well as federal employees and officials who might be involved.

These photographs explain why the federal government has so long concealed the autopsy photographs -- the 22 color photographs and the 18 black and white photographs -- and has kept them under lock and key in concrete vaults. They explain why not a single member of the Warren Commission dared to look at these autopsy photographs -- because they knew that they would see wounds caused by gunshots from a number of different directions. They explain why the United States Justice Department -- under Ramsey Clark --

has worked so diligently to obstruct any legitimate investigation and to interfere with any trials connected with this case. They explain why the President of the United States, by executive order, concealed vital files and important evidence so that no one could see them for 75 years. (This was meant to assure that all persons now living would be dead before the truth about the assassination could come to the surface.)

These photographs indicate that President Lyndon Johnson -- who commands the federal agencies and who appointed the Warren Commission -- necessarily must know that the conclusion of the Warren Commission is a fraud and that the people of the United States have been fooled.

In the absence of a prompt explanation by the federal government as to why this bullet has been kept concealed, there is no alternative but to conclude that the entire assassination investigation and the Warren Commission inquiry comprised an elaborate camouflage designed to protect the assassins of President Kennedy as well as the men behind them.

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
