The evidence listed below was received in the Laboratory today with a memorandum dated January 31, 1964, to Mr. Sullivan from W. A. Branigan.

Q475 Envelope postmarked "17 ENE. 64-17" "Mexico D.F 5:00 PM" addressed: "Sr, Robert Kennedy, Ministro de Justicia Washington, Estados Unidos"

Q476 Accompanying letter beginning: "Mexico D:F. Dic de 1963..." and signed, "Ernesto Flores Luna," followed by an illegible handwritten flourish resembling a capital "J"

Results:

It was found that the typewriter used to type specimens Q475 and Q476 was not used to type the pertinent previous typed specimens in this case, specimens Q232 through Q235 and Q350A through Qc353, which is correspondence signed "Pedro Charles," "Maro del Rosario Molina," and "Miguel Galban Lopez."

The typing on specimens Q475 and Q476, except the numerals (which are sometimes varied on special order), most closely matches Underwood Small Victoria, spaced ten letters to the inch.

The envelope Q475 and the sheet of paper of Q476 differ from the envelopes and paper of Q232 through Q235 and Q350A and Q351 previously submitted in this case. Specimens Qc352 and Qc353 are photocopies. However, from such examination as can be made from these copies, physical differences between Qc352 and Qc353 on the one hand and the current specimens Q475 and Q476 on the other hand were noted. Specimens Q475 and Q476 are retained in the Laboratory.

RECOMMENDATION: For information and appropriate action of the Domestic Intelligence Division.

THE DEPARTMENT HAS FURNISHED THE BUREAU TYPEWRITTEN LETTER AND ENVELOPE IN SPANISH LANGUAGE SENT TO ATTORNEY GENERAL ROBERT F. KENNEDY BY ONE ERNESTO FLORES LUNA NOT FURTHER IDENTIFIED, POSTMARKED MEXICO D. F. JANUARY SEVENTEEN LAST, LETTER STATES: WE TAKE THE LIBERTY OF REPRODUCING WITH CARE CERTAIN DOCUMENTS WHICH ARRIVED FROM TAPACHULA, STATE OF CHIAPAS, ADDRESSED TO OSWALD, ASSASSIN OF YOUR BROTHER. DOCUMENTS WERE ADDRESSED BY CLERK IN SHOE STORE OF [REDACTED] [REDACTED] FIDEL CASTRO'S INTIMATE FRIEND AND THE MAN WHO WAS DELIVERING SHIPMENTS FROM HIM TO OSWALD AND THREE OTHER PEOPLE WHO WERE TO ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT LOPEZ MATEOS OF MEXICO. HOWEVER, [REDACTED] INDICATED HE WAS INTERESTED IN THE PRESIDENT OF THE U.S. FLORES STATED MORE DOCUMENTS POSSIBLY EXIST IN [REDACTED] RESIDENCE. HE ALSO INDICATED [REDACTED] AND IT WAS NOTICED QUOTE PRIOR TO ALL OF THIS THAT HE WAS KEEPING VARIOUS INDIVIDUALS OF DIFFERENT NATIONALITIES IN HIS HOUSE, INCLUDING OSWALD WHO WAS IN MEXICO LOOKING FOR WORK AND THEN WENT TO TEXAS UNQUOTE. WHILE ABOVE INDICATES ENCLOSURES

REFERENCE IS ALSO MADE TO LEGAT, MEXICO LETTER JANUARY TWENTY DASH FOUR LAST WHEREIN SOURCES ADVISED ELIZABETH CATLETTMORA STATES CP OF MEXICO INTERESTED IN DATA RE OSWALD'S TRIP TO MEXICO AS OSWALD COULD ONLY BE LINKED TO MEXICO THROUGH ACTIVITIES PRIOR TO HIS GOING TO SOVIET UNION. ABOVE LETTER DOES NOT INDICATE TIME OF EVENTS INDICATED THEREIN.

LEGAT, MEXICO, THROUGH AVAILABLE SOURCES, ATTEMPT TO IDENTIFY [REDACTED] AND RESOLVE ABOVE ALLEGATIONS. ALSO IDENTIFY ERNESTO FLORES LUNA AND INTERVIEW FOR MORE SPECIFIC DATA RE THIS MATTER. IN ABSENCE OF INFORMATION DICTATING TO CONTRARY, ENDEAVOR TO HAVE [REDACTED] INTERVIEWED RE ABOVE. PROMPTLY ADVISE RESULTS AND SUBMIT LHM SUITABLE FOR DISSEMINATION. COPY FURNISHED DALLAS BY MAIL.

NOTE: Above letter referred to Bureau via Assistant Director Courtney Evans. Full translation of letter has been made and Laboratory has compared typed envelope and letter with other typing specimens in this case with negative results. The above action, therefore, appears in order.
