Dear Alex,

The pages of the F.INQ tickler obtained in an FOIA lawsuit by Mark Allen to which I referred last night, enclosed, has paperclips copied on it because of the purposes for which I made the copy from which I've made this copy. The paperclips I added to draw attention to certain language for my special purposes some months sgo. The unknown and to now unpublished fact of the FBI's preparation of dossiers on the Commission members is the last item on the third page. On the next page you'll find reference to what also was not known earlier and also is unpublished, that after the "eport was out the FBI prepared additional dossiers on the staff.

From the FBIHW file titled Liaison With the Warren Commission I enclose what I did not refer to as a substitute for what I was unable to find right away, 62-109090-160. Hoover, despite what you found in the FBIHQ Warren file, did have lunch with Warren a time I did not recall, 5/13/64.

In searching for the Hoover memo I recall about an earlier lunch with Warren that resulted in the FBI's bugging and wiretapping of Marina Oswald, I found that all of the Marina Oswald "subject" files prior to this year are not where they belong. I do not know whether they are in an accumulation of unfiled records that I am not now physically able to refile, whether others using the files misplaced the

or whether they were stolen. However, I found a related and slightly earlier record, Not Recorded in the same main file, of 2/24/64. You may recall that I told you that this was as of the end of that month and was discontinued the next month. At about the middle of page 6 you will see that the idea for electronic surveillance on her originated with the FBI. In the end they did stake farina's home out, and I have that file, from Dallas, and they bugged the house before she moved it, without asking for authorization, and they tapped her phone, with the request for permission to Bobby Kennedy from Hoover saying that Warren had requested it. I have that file, two.

If this does not serve your purposes let me know and I'll undrtake to search Volume 4 of the 109090 file to see if the records I recall are in it.



On May 13, 1934, at the invitation of Chief Justice Earl Warren I had luncheon with the Chief Justice in his private dining room. We discussed generally the problems affecting law enforcement and also those which have arisen in connection with the work of the Presidential Commission on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy headed by the Chief Justice and before which I was to appear the following day. The luncheon was entirely pleasant.

headed by the Chief Justice. Present at this meeting were the Chief Justice, of Senator John Sherman Cooper of Kentucky, Mr. Allen Dulles, Representative Gerald R. Ford of Michigan, Representative Halo Bogs of Louisiana, and the General Counsel of the Commission, J. Lee Francia.

L began my testimony at 9:00 AM and finished at 11:30 AM. It, of a course, has been recorded and copies of it have been sent to the Eureau for eview and such corrections as may be necessary. It was obvious that the stenotype operator was getting very little of what I was saying and of the guestions which were being propounded to me.

Mr. Malley just before the hearings started.
