With the best of intention if not, I think, the best of judgment, Bob took Wayne there and had him sign in as "investigator" in order to show Ray some pictures and in order to frustrate the constant pen leaks which had reporters all over the place when visitors left.

As I see no need for surveillance on Chastain to fire him - I left messages at the paper for him often enough if the connection itself had meaning - that it was directed against me, at least primarily, has other support. My room was entered and searched. Lomar's mail at the motel was everly opened and this was attributed to "accident." I did not get messages. My message light went crazy often enough when I was using the phone but under no other circumstances. And my outgoing mail, deposited in the slot in the hall-captain's stand, was delayed. A letter I put there at the latest the morning of 11/2 was not postmarked until 11/4.

Going along with this Meile was openly asking questions about my background and connections. His questions went past anything that has been published. With my old-fashioned ideas about what is right and what is wrong for the State or for prosecutors I regard all this as highly improper.

But if I was surveilled by the Memphis Publishing Company, I wonder if they did not violate my rights.
