3 Ku Klux Klan Members Fired From Police Force

Three Chicago policemen Klatt members two months were dismissed from the force ago, when Policeman James Friday as members of the Ku Tobin infiltrated the Klan to Klux Klan.

A five-man police board found them guilty of charges of misconduct including discbedience of police department regulations. All pleaded not guilty.

Police Supt. James B. Conlisk said that membership in the klan was contrary to the policies of the police department.

Superintendent Explains

Heath, head of the klan in Illinois and a surrounding sixstate area, was identified as head of a six-man klan cell in the police department. A raid by police on his home on Dec. 28 uncovered a cache of guns, hand grenades, and 200,000 rounds of ammunition, along with klan flags and literature.

Plogger, who had been on the force since 1954, was identified as vice president of the klan in Illinois.

3 Others Resign

Three other members of the force who were identified as klan members by Conlisk subsequently resigned.

They are Patrolmen Richard Stanton, 33, of 3350 62d pl., and Jon T. Johansson, 26, of 329 N. Latrobe av., both assigned to the Fillmore district, and Dennis Aloia, 25, of 4940 Concord av., Austin district.

Three members of the Chicago police department were fired yesterday for being members of the Ku Klux Klan, Franklin Kreml, president of the police board, announced.

They are Patrolman Donald Heath, 30, of 2055 N. Lawndale av.; William Plogger, 43, of 2340 N. Lawndale av., and Ernest R. Semet, 32, of 3338 N. Oriole av.

Heath had been assigned to the Fillmore district and Plogger and Semet to the Shakespeare district.
