Dear John,

Here is a Xerox of the first Dell agreement, the one that covers the current problem. I think you can make it out. When the Xeroxing was done several lines were hidden. I have written them in.

We did not mention Capitol yesterday when you phoned. What did counsel think of the possibility of a suit there?

I am inclined to agree with their estimate of what Dell is doing and why. Bearing on it is their continuing strong push with the bomb, Scavengers.

Your letter of 9/20 arrived this a.m., taking only two days longer than one from England mailed two days later. There is no time to respond and make the outgoing mail because of the orders to go and a few urgent letters, like to the British publisher who is going to do O in H.O. and is screwed up, but good.

Let me give you the status of POST MORTEM: I've read all but the last two chapters, making only a few essential corrections. Bill has typed (final typing) first two. I'll finish, I hope including the part of the epilogue that I can now do (I'm still getting material for it) before bedtime. Until she finishes final typing I will add to the epilogue. Once that point is reached, anything else will have to wait, for must get that book out, too. I'll key the appendix in while she indexes. We'll have an index in that, like in PW, name only because it is largely on the single subject. Afterwards, we have already arranged for a friend to do subject indexes for both, using the headings we have already established.
