This record seems, although it does not so state, to have been caused by the Church committee investigation, more likely that of the Schweiker subcommittee.

It has on the first page in the lower left-hand corner an entirely different stamp form than I have seen. Opposite Index is a not very legible numerical reference to the indexing. This should make retrieval of records sought under FBI easier.

There are two withholdings apparently related to the informer. In each case I believe there is other reasonably segregable material that is withheld and that does not identify the informer, assuming the informer remains unidentified.
