Mr. JOHN CIRAVOLO, JR., 4313 South Carrollton Avenue, advised that he joined the Moisant Airport unit of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) in 1954 and remained in the unit for two or three years. After assassination of President KENNEDY he watched a number of the television programs and thought that the face of LEE HARVEY OSWALD was familiar but could not place him. Subsequently, he saw a program on which EDWARD VOEBEL appeared and VOEBEL said during the program that he, VOEBEL, had taken OSWALD to a few meetings of the CAP. CIRAVOLO then recalled that OSWALD had been in the CAP for a short time and he believed OSWALD had been in long enough to have a uniform. He said that OSWALD must have been quiet, that the rest of them were a "noisy bunch" and that if OSWALD had been one of the "noisy bunch", he would have recalled him better. He said that he could remember nothing else about OSWALD.

Mr. CIRAVOLO said that prior to the shooting of OSWALD he had never heard of JACK RUBY and thus, would know of no possible connection between OSWALD and RUBY.
