Dear Steve,

The check you said you were sending did not arrive. I have looked up my records. I know they are incomplete, for they do not include the books I hand-delivered to you when I was there. If I have a record, I cannot immediately locate it. I can only hope you do have one.

July 11, 1967 we sent 5 copies PW, \$12/88; March 5, 1968, 15 copies, \$8.08; March 22, 1968, 10 copies, \$3.71. This totals \$23.67, less whatever you may not have sold. You need not now return them. I will always give you credit as long as they are fit to sell. But I'd appreciate a check for what you have sold. When I get it I will, in turn be able to say you that I owe you. Please make me a note or a bill on this, so I can have a record.

When I was out there employed with the Goldman's, I gave you a supply of the various books. I have a vague notion it was about two dozen. You will perhaps have a clear recollection.

In February, when he was supposed to interview me and did not, Art Rankin ordered some of the books for his stores. He was going to mention them in the papers. This was in March 1968. The books were shipped from the printer's, in Washington, so I do not have the records here. The total was about \$25, less 40%, less than we gave you because we could not get the wholesaler. I lessed him about this, for we urgently need the money. Do not make a special trip when you see there will be okay. He can return for full credit any unsold copies, as long as they can be resold. He'd best insure them to protect himself. He need not touch the returns, but we need like the check.

When you do the memo on Ferguson, I think it would be wise to include some on the entire Bradley thing. As it is, there is a chance it could be wrong and put us in a position not to be ruined if it is. We should always regard this as a possibility. Also, did Saxley ever do anything suspicious, to your knowledge. These things can be very important. If you doubt my judgement, check this with Reggie and get her opinion, but do not pull a Jaffe, do not go elsewhere.
