Note = Ronald Gene Smith according to Jim Wade of The Valley was one of 4 persons to die in a plane crash. Wade has an AP wire story dated March 12, 1967 which states that Smith and Wm. F. Hodges of 2907 Emme Way, (Dallas), son F. Slaughter of 12200 Boston Drive (Dallas) who worked for Thuron Industries, and a Tracy D. Click were killed in a plane crash. Click's address was given as 2121 W. Irwin Blvd, Irving, Texas. Wade suggested that Click might be the same one as Darryl Click mentioned in Henry Wade's press conference with man who drove toward in a cab to his home.

Note that both Smith and Slaughter worked for Thuron Industries of Dallas.
