
This is in response to your January 27, 1987 letter, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), requesting records pertaining to Click Magazine material, under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act, Title 5 U.S. Code 552. The FBI, on September 16, 1988, forwarded your letter with a copy of one Army-originated record, retrieved from their files, for a decision as to the releasability of the information to you. This correspondence was received in this office on September 20, 1988.

We have reviewed the information in the Army record and have determined that it contains only a brief reference to Click Magazine and no mention of you. The portion pertaining to Click states that an individual, other than yourself, once obtained photographs for the magazine to illustrate an expose of Nazi activities in the U.S.; and that this was one of the earliest of such features to appear in the magazine.

Since the remainder of the report pertained to individuals and activities not relating to you or to Click Magazine, it was considered to be outside the scope of your request and was not addressed.
