Mr. Crowley advised that subsequent to the time the material had been turned over to Donovan's organization for its use, pictures and a portion of the material obtained by Chavkin appeared in "Click" magazine. Mr. Crowley further advised that as above outlined, Chavkin had no direct association with Donovan's organization but was, in fact, employed by "Click" magazine. (S-1)

The material transmitted by Chavkin consisted of pictures of individuals alleged to be Mazi agents, pictures of Masi meetings, important plants and factories in Santiago and related documentary material supporting the photographs

According to Mr. Crowley, Weisburg called at his office recently and asked for the return of the pictures in the possession of Donovan's organization. These pictures were accordingly returned to Weisburg, at which time he, Weisburg, stated that they anticipated sending a representative to South America to gather more data on subversive activities in South America, and stated, "We may have some interesting material for you (meaning Donovan's organization) at a later date." (5-1) (1)

Wr. Crowley advised that although the material was of some interest, Weisburg was using Donovan's organization to get the material out of South America, inasmuch as no request had ever been made for the material and no arrangements were made by Colonel Donovan's organization to send Chavkin to South America.
