GALE SUBJECT ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY Mr. Joseph Giordano, who advised he is employed in Mrs. Lincoln's Office at the Archives, called concerning late President Kennedy's clothing. Mr. Giordano advised that he had just recently begun working at Archives and had been assigned by Mrs. Lincoln to 'tracing down the late President's clothing." He stated he understood the Bureau had certain articles of clothing in connection with our official investigation and he was interested in learning what the proper procedure would be to obtain these articles. The Bureau does have some articles of the late President's as official exhibits obtained during our investigation. At the expiration of the Warren Commission, the Department was directed to handle the disposition of the official exhibits in this matter. The Bureau has corresponded with the Department concerning this matter and it was suggested to Mr. Giordano that he direct his inquiry to the Attorney General's Office. Mr. Giordano stated he had been in touch with the Office of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and it had been suggested to him that he call the Attorney General's Office, which he would do. Evans BICCT: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY On the morning of August 25, 1964, a Mr. George Miller in the office of Mrs. Lincoln, the late President Kennedy's secretary, called my office. Mr. Miller stated Mrs. Lincoln, who has offices at the Archives, at the request of Mrs. John Kennedy is seeking information as to the location and availability of the clothing worn by the late President Kennedy at the time he was assassinated. According to Miller, Mrs. Kennedy desires to obtain this clothing. ACTION: Since the clothing in question is part of exhibits under the jurisdiction of the Warren Commission, it was suggested to Mr. Miller that the proper place to obtain the desired information was the Varren Commission.
