At approximately 3:15 PM, Today, Inspector JAMES R. MALLEY telephonically furnished a portion of a letter received at the Bureau today, from the WARREN Commission.

"We would like to have a plat of the immediate locale in Irving, Texas, which would show the PAINE residence, the RANDLE-FRAZIER residence and the surrounding lots and streets across which OSWALD may have walked. We suggest that if this land has been platted, there should be a plat available at the County Courthouse, that would show the size and dimensions of the lot and on this plat, it could be superimposed to scale the outlines of the improvements. In particular, we are concerned with showing the RANDLE-FRAZIER house and carport as accurately as possible including a location of windows. *Rec*

"We would like a photograph of the Irving, Texas, area which would show the RANDLE-FRAZIER house and carport with windows and also have shots taken from the viewpoint of a person looking out of these windows or coming out of the door along the path or route followed by OSWALD on the morning of November 22nd. According to the interview with Mrs. RANDLE appearing on pages ~~288-289~~ of GEMBERLING's report dated 12/10/63, she saw OSWALD walking diagonally from 5th Street in a northeasterly direction, across Westbrook Street toward the back of the house while she was standing at her sink looking out the window. She says she opened the back door a slight bit to see what OSWALD was doing, and saw him go to the far side of her brother's car which was parked just north of the carport and headed in an easterly direction toward Westbrook Street and saw OSWALD open the right rear door of the car. To double check credibility and accuracy of her testimony, we would like to have these plats be made so as to show accurately these reference points so that we can verify whether or not a person with such line of vision would be able to see what Mrs. RANDLE states in her interviews. Also, if there are any photographs of the FRAZIER car we would like these available. *1/2*

"We would also like to have the application for driver's license for OSWALD together with the application for employment with the photograph concern to be used to examine the witness FRAZIER.

Handwritten: "We would like to have a plat available for the Texas School Book Depository Building with particular reference to the employee parking lot where FRAZIER parked his car on that morning and the entry way used by OSWALD which FRAZIER described as the first door on the back of the Depository Building, and also any other entry ways from this area together with a plat of the first floor so that FRAZIER can describe and show the course OSWALD took upon entering into the building. We would also like to have pictures of the exterior and interior of the building at this point. We would like to make sure that the first floor plat is available to us not later than 3/9/64. In addition, as soon as possible, but not necessarily by 3/9, could you please furnish us with complete floor plans of the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh floors of the Texas School Book Depository Building? Could you please indicate on these plans the location of the employee lunch room, dressing room and soft drink dispensary and the location and condition when found, of

1. The three spent 6.5 mm cartridges
2. The C-14 rifle that was found in the building
3. The C-10 wrapping paper bag
4. Any "Ten Rolling Readers" cartons found in the area immediately adjacent to the crime scene
5. The clipboard referred to on page 381 of GEMBERLING's report dated 12/10/63
6. The blue jacket referred to on page 209 of GEMBERLING's report dated 12/23/63.
7. The finger and palm prints of LEE HARVEY OSWALD found on the various cartons found at the crime scene

Handwritten: "In the case of any finger and palm prints, could you please indicate the finger or palm which left the print and the direction which the finger or palm pointed. Also, could you please indicate

where 'Ten Rolling Readers' cartons were generally stored."

Upon completion of dictation of above letter, Inspector MALLEY advised that he had informed the Department that their request was of such magnitude that it would be physically impossible to obtain the desired plats and photos in the prescribed time.

He stated they then requested that if at all possible that they be furnished the info requested for 3/9/64, no later than 3/10/64.

Inspector MALLEY was advised that this project would take a minimum of 2 weeks with qualified draftsmen. He stated that we should review the matter, determine the amount of work and also determine if a local contractor could compile the desired plats and then submit our recommendations as to whether a local contractor should be employed or if Inspector GAUTHIER and his assistants should come to Dallas to compile the desired info. He stated this recommendation should be submitted tomorrow morning.
