I thought you deserved to see how I handled your information and your book, giving your address.

I might add that I communicated with the chairman of the House Rules Committee, Ray Madden, an old friend about the Gonzalez resolution, and he told me somewhat testily that resolution was not before the Rules Committee, and Gonzalez had not talked to him about it.

I veer to the idea, not through any hard documentary evidence, but rather through hunches that the assassination was planned by organized crime, using some of its own people, some of the Cuban Mafia, and suggest an article on this in the Texas Observer (11-30-73) by Earl Goltz, a Dallas Morning News investigative reporter.

Organized crime had enormous influence under Nixon as VP, was badly disappointed when Kennedy won, because this meant ~~return~~ return to the Havana casinos was out and Bobby Kennedy <sup>would</sup> ~~might~~ take on organized crime.

I think Nixon infiltrated Mafia elements into CIA and this created a great internal conflict that still rages.
