C.I.A. Officer Will Head Bureau at State Department

WASHINGTON, Oct. 4 (UPI)

— The State Department announced today the appointment of an officer of the Central Intelligence Agency as head of its Bureau of Intelligence and Research.

He is Ray S. Cline, 51 years old, at present listed as a special adviser to the American Embassy in Bonn. The department said Mr. Cline was expected to take office about Nov. 1. He succeeds Thomas L. Hughes, who has been assigned to the United States Embassy in London as Deputy Chief of the Mission.

Mr. Cline, who holds a doctorate in history and international relations from Harvard, is a native of Illinois. He was a cryptanalyst with the Navy in 1941 to 1943, chief of the Current Intelligence Staff of the Office of Strategic Services from 1943 to 1946, and from 1946 to 1949 was with the Army's historical division.
