CIA Tie Charged To Mexican Official

TOLUCA, Mexico, Aug. 12—the first case of a Mexican civil servant being fired for suspected links with the CIA was officially reported here today.

Humberto Carrillo Colon, press officer in the Justice Ministry of the state of Mexico, where he had easy access to files on politicians, was accused by members of a revolutionary youth movement. The accusers also noted that Carrillo Colon had been expelled from Cuba on charges of working for the CIA in 1969 when he was press attache at the Mexican embassy in Havana.

CIA activities in Mexico were revealed several weeks ago by Philip B. Agee, who said he was an agent in 1967 and 1968 under the cover of being "Olympic attache" at the U.S. embassy. The Agee revelations implicated former President Gustavo Diaz Ordaz. President Luis Echeverria has ordered a federal investigation.
