For what
it's worth



It was probably the most well witnessed murder in the entire history of crime.

Millions upon millions of Americans saw the shackled man walk down the corridor littered with newsmen. They easily identified him as Lee Harvey Oswald, "the misfit Marxist with a life long persecution complex" who had only hours before allegedly assassinated John F.

Kennedy.

Suddenly there appeared on the TV screen a heavy set man in a white hat. A gunshot rang out accompanied by a puff of smoke and Oswald doubled over while clutching his stomach in pain.

There was a scant few hours of waiting and then the word came in. The drama was over. A president was

dead. His assassin had been killed. Justice had been served.

Why then has the case surrounding the events of the weekend of November 22, 1963 refused to die???

One reason is that post-assassination investigators have found much to doubt in the official evidence presented to the Warren Commission. They have found receptive ears within the ranks of the American people. But it may have been the American people's eyes that allowed them to swallow the most incredible lie of all surrounding the JFK assassination. That lie was that Lee Harvey Oswald was dead at the hands of Jack Ruby on Sunday, November 24th.

The theory that forces of



the CIA were actually behind JFK's assassination is well known in 1973. But what is not well known is that many investigators believe that Lee Oswald was a patsy who did not even fire a shot on November 22, 1963. He had not killed President Kennedy nor had he killed Officer J.D. Tippit, the policeman who died shortly after the assassination.

Jim Garrison, the much maligned (and recently exonerated) former New Orleans District Attorney writes of the investigation of Oswald's last few hours alive in his book A HERITAGE OF STONE.

"Back in Dallas (on Friday, November 22, 1963) Oswald had been given a paraffin test to see if he had on his cheeks the nitrate deposits caused by firing a

rifle. The test showed that he had no nitrate deposits on either cheek, a fact which supported the proposition that he had not fired any rifle that day. If Oswald had been allowed to live long enough to go to trial, the absence of nitrate on both cheeks would have been powerful evidence for his exoneration.

"Nevertheless, the announcement was made that the test showed that Oswald indeed, had fired a rifle, and this incriminating news circled the world, satisfying hundreds of millions that the President's assassin had been caught.

"Similarly, it was announced that Oswald was identified as having been the man who killed Officer J.D. Tippit. This news also flew around the globe, lending further substance to the

picture of Lee Oswald as a deranged, ruthless killer.

Actually, two eye-witnesses at the scene of the Tippit murder indicated that Oswald was not the officer's murderer. Acquilla Clemons, who observed the incident, was firm in saying that Oswald was not the man who killed Tippit. Domingo Benavides, the closest witness to the shooting, gave a description of the killer which so completely eliminated Oswald as a suspect that he was never called to the lineup to look at Oswald. This news, however, did not go around the world. For these reasons also, had Oswald lived, in all likelihood he would have been exonerated."

If he didn't kill John F. Kennedy or Officer J.D. Tippit, then the question remains "who was Lee

Harvey Oswald."

J.J. Carlisle (not his real name) is a midwesterner who has been conducting, with his own money, an investigation of the incidents in Dallas on the weekend of November 22, 1963.

"In reviewing all the evidence," said Carlisle in an exclusive interview with FLASH, "it seems clear that Lee Oswald was an operative of the CIA. His pre-assassination history shows that he had some friends within the United States government and was probably working for some branch. The CIA is the most logical.

"On the actual day of the assassination, Oswald was undoubtedly stationed somewhere in or near Dealey Plaza where the President was killed. He was knowingly





working for the CIA on that day and was possibly one of many who were given strange and specific orders to carry-out in case commotion of any kind happened.

"Oswald was told that in case of some disturbance, he was to proceed immediately on foot to a specified movie theatre which he was to enter without buying a ticket. He was probably told that he would then be contacted for his report on what he had witnessed in the plaza.

"Orders like these would not have been strange to an operative of the CIA. But imagine Oswald's total bewilderment when he was told he was being arrested for the murder of JFK! Many investigators tell of the complete astonishment Oswald registered during his arrest.

"The key to Oswald's capture was that he had not bought a ticket to get in the theatre. This was what caused the owner to alert the police. There may have been several men with these attention getting orders trotting around Dallas that day. Oswald was simply the first to be caught. Or he may have been the lone "patsy" in the conspiracy, with Tippitt's death carefully planned to lead Dallas police in the direction of a man who had not fired a shot at the President but who was being set up as the guilty party.

"After his arrest, Oswald was taken to Dallas Police Headquarters where he was interrogated. It has been noted by many investigators that Lee Harvey Oswald at no time admitted that he shot John Kennedy or Officer Tippitt. This seems rather strange for a man who supposedly shot the President to gain national attention. It has also been noted that there are no records of any kind that were kept during Oswald's interrogation. For this reason, it cannot be ascertained just who talked to Oswald or what kind of questions he was asked.

"It is known that Jack Ruby under several different guises was present during the short hours of Oswald's interment. Ruby has also been identified as an operative for the CIA. It would have been fairly simple for Ruby to slip word to Oswald of the incredible masquerade that was to take place on Sunday, the 24th of November.

"Many investigators have come up with the conclusions as I have stated them thus far. They believe that Oswald was set up to take the fall for killing JFK and that Ruby shot and killed him before he broke down and told all he knew about the CIA.

"But killing off operatives is not a good way of recruiting fresh faces for the CIA. Instead, I think that

Ruby and Oswald played out a very important piece of acting on that Sunday.

"Picture the setting for a moment. Millions of people are waiting anxiously to see the hated killer transferred. They see the villain appear, and then suddenly a man steps out and fires a shot. The villain falls over in pain.

"How many times have we seen such a scene in the movies? The guns are blank or had "blood bullets" in them. The action is real, but nobody dies. Instead, Oswald is whisked away and we are later told he dies. There is an autopsy and then a burial. But strangely enough, no one is allowed to witness the coffin being lowered.

"If you were the CIA and you wanted the world to believe that someone was dead, what better place to stage his murder than right in front of millions of people. There was only one man who could possibly have told all about the murder of JFK. But now he was "dead" and the case was laid to rest.

"Ruby on the other hand, spent a few years in jail where he either unfortunately or "mysteriously died" of cancer.

"I believe that Lee Harvey Oswald was a grade B actor at his own murder. And that he is still alive today to tell the truth about the assassination of John Fitzgerald Kennedy."
