Dear Mike,

Your certified mailing of the 21st came today. Thanks for all of it.

I'll read NATO on Incapacitants as soon as I can, probably on the bus in the morning on the way to Washington for a hearing on one of my FOIA suits, or returning. Glad to have it. Many thanks.

There is much of possible interest in that Olson page, Kirkpatrick's 1/30/54 on "Items of Effect of LSD in Files of TSS. Like anxiety in 6 out of 7 case, 41 % of self-hostility, with depression occurring, that LSD can't be given to some people, and all this in TSS files before giving it to Olson.

The case of the acute depression lasting 14 days also is interesting.

Two projects identifications are masked. The six names we know will not fit either space. A combination of letters and numbers could.

I get some of the possible point in the xerox of the pages of the Los Angeles Times of Sunday, October 19, 1952 on which had been scrawled, "Conklin, we have been watching you." But with the xeroxing, including the over-exposed copy, I cannot make out the lettering scrawled across the aerial view of the freeway construction.

The author of the mailgram seems to have some knowledge. I take it "GINA-PIG" is a misspelling and that the unclear number is "52."

Back to the scrawl: I can make some out, like "next," "We" and the swastika.
