+The Justice Dept. must authorize burial, and Attorney General  
Janet Reno has received a letter from James H. Linn, head of the  
non-profit Assassination Archives and Research Center, asking if the  
fragments could be removed before the burial. In 1971, a  
forensic pathologist and longtime Warren Commission advisor, joined  
Linn in the request.

+One hour before the burial, Justice Department spokeswoman  
Caroline Connolly said no decision had been made about the  
request.

+But according to an ABC news report, family members refused to  
allow the fragments to be removed. "It's not an issue for me,"  
Connolly, a spokeswoman, said Thursday.

+According to the Warren Commission report, Connolly was hit by  
just one bullet, the so-called magic bullet shot from the  
communist sniper DUB. This bullet entered Connolly's back, exited  
through her chest, passed through his right arm and into his left  
thigh.

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+Weisberg said that if any of the fragments were found, a body  
believed was that that could have come from that one bullet. That  
would disprove the Warren Commission report right then and there. If

+If any one of the fragments is too long to have come from the  
base of that bullet, that too would destroy the Warren report. He  
said

+If the fragments were from a different kind of bullet than the  
one allegedly fired by Lee Harvey Oswald, that would lend credence  
to the conspiracy theory, he said.

+Connell, himself said he was hit by a separate bullet. Weisberg  
said for him said he heard the bullet fired when he looked, and  
that he was after that, that he felt a bullet hit him. Weisberg  
said

+The family was also standing in the neighborhood  
lineup, as well as with Connell. She heard the other bullet  
before she saw the second bullet strike Connell. She said.
