For your information, I've interested Ramparts in doing a long, long article on the assassination. It will be based largely on the flaws in the Warren Commission's own record and will be aimed at showing factually, by the commission's own testimony, that there had to be more than one guman---there had to be a conspiracy, a plot. This is, I think, provable beyond a reasonable doubt.

I may go on to a book treatment of this later; I would like to. So, if it's agreeable with you, I will keep all of the material you have sent me in my files for the time being. If you need any of it back or want it returned sooner, let me know and I'll see you get it.

Once more, thanks for the help.
