This is a copy of the death certificate of Hollywood actress Norma Jean Baker who used the name "Marilyn Monroe". The certificate suggests probable suicide but evidence indicates that Miss Baker was murdered.

Blocking of an inquest into the recent death of Mary Jo Kopechne establishes that the Kennedy family have been consistent in blocking legal inquests.

At the time of Miss Baker's death she was romantically involved with the late Senator Robert F. Kennedy, according to the book "Strange Death of Marilyn Monroe." No coroner's inquest was ever held and no real investigation involving questioning witnesses under oath.

The book raises the questions:

"Did the trouble begin when Marilyn realized that her V.I.P. had no intention of getting a divorce and marrying her? Did she insist he fulfill his promises to her or face her making public their relationship? Neither of these alternatives would appeal to Mr. V.I.P. (Robert Kennedy). Since Marilyn could destroy him either by talking or with written evidence, did he decide to take drastic action?"

The book is raised above the gossip level by its author's credentials as a thorough investigator, and by the amazing evidence that he turned up.

Miss Baker's doctor, Dr. Hyman Engelberg, was an identified Communist. The wife of her principal beneficiary was an identified Communist. Her third and last husband was an admitted former Communist whose break with the Party was not so clean that he would cooperate with a congressional investigating committee. Miss Baker was naive, and probably the unwitting tool of Communists—and she frequently was out of their control.

Strangely, Senator Kennedy's violent death came in the same county (Los Angeles) at a time when he appeared to be out of control.

Senator Kennedy frequently used his influence as Attorney General to block legal inquests and autopsies by local officials. It will be remembered that the body of President John Kennedy was unlawfully "stolen" from Dallas authorities who wanted to observe the law by holding a thorough autopsy and inquest. The Dallas coroner appeared at Love Field in an effort to uphold the law by keeping John Kennedy's body in Dallas, but by sheer power and disregard for law, the U.S. Justice Department removed the corpus delecti.

Thus we see an astonishing "Inquest Gap" in matters which might shed light on deaths that have involved the Kennedy Family.

Discrepancies of major portions appear in the "official versions" given the public in the deaths of John Kennedy, Norma Jean Baker (Marilyn Monroe) and Mary Jo Kopechne, and probably in the death of Senator Robert Kennedy himself.
