Dallas D.A. Won't Appear In JFK Film PALLAS, Sept. 15-Dallas

DALLAS, Sept. 15—Dallas District Attorney Henry Wade said last night he has decided not to take part in a planned movie on the assassination of President Kennedy.

Wade, visibly upset over what he said was "adverse publicity" given his proposed role in the documentary film, "Countdown in Dallas," told newsmen, "I am through with it and out. I'll have nothing to do with the film."

The district attorney denied that he had been offered \$20,-000 by producer Robert Larsen of Colorado Springs to appear in the documentary and to make his personal files on the assassination available to Larsen.

He did say he had spoken to Larsen about the movie on several occasions, and also admitted that he was a director of Flag Star Inc., which holds the rights to the script.
