THE CSA HAS "ARRIVED" -- IT IS NOW BEING SMEARED!

During the past week a column by Raymond Moley has appeared in newspapers throughout the country. In the NEW ORLEANS TIMES-PICAYUNE, it was headlined "Kamikaze Raids From the Far Right." In the LOS ANGELES TIMES, this same column was headlined "The Dissenters in California and New York Are Not Conservatives."

Enclosed you will find a photo-offset reproduction of Moley's column as it appeared in the LOS ANGELES TIMES of August 12. (The marking on the article was made by the CSA member who sent this column to us.) You will note that Raymond Moley states:

"...However, a group in Sacramento, which is a branch of a so-called party called Conservatives of America, with headquarters in New Orleans, has decided to attempt to destroy Nixon by supporting and voting for Governor Brown."

Our reaction to the above is that Moley is: (1) Deliberately distorting facts in order to create confusion; or (2) is so misinformed or uninformed as to render worthless his opinion on the subject; or (3) is following the dictates of NEWSWEEK Magazine, for which he is a regular contributing columnist.

WAS MOLEY DISTORTING TO CREATE CONFUSION?

I have just talked by long distance telephone

with Mr. Bruce Anderson, Chairman of the Sacramento County Unit of the Conservative Society of America. Mr. Anderson categorically denied Moley's allegations that the Sacramento Unit "has decided to attempt to destroy Nixon by supporting and voting for Governor Brown." As a matter of fact, Mr. Anderson states that he has never been contacted by Raymond Moley or anyone from Moley's office.

It should be remembered that one of the oldest tricks of the Communists and the Liberals is to attempt to "put words in your mouth," words designed to cause confusion within Conservative ranks.

IS RAYMOND MOLEY MERELY MISINFORMED?

Note that Moley refers to the CSA as "a so-called party called Conservatives of America, with headquarters in New Orleans." The CSA is NOT a political party, nor is it a "so-called party," nor is it a third party. Its only purpose is to elect Conservatives to Congress regardless of party affiliation.

Then in a further attempt to deliberately confuse, Moley, by editorial legerdemain, throws in for good measure the next paragraph:

"In New York a Conservative Party has selected candidates to help defeat Rockefeller and Javits and elect certain Democratic candidates who have not yet been chosen."

The purpose of this particular paragraph

as apparently to create the impression that iy group which supported Conservatives for ongress was, ipso facto, a political party, id that because the Conservative Party of ew York is running candidates, and the CSA endorsing candidates, that both are part id parcel of a third party, which, of course, ightens Mr. Moley.

Despite the impression that Moley attempts give, the CSA is not associated with the Conervative Party in New York, although, of purse, the CSA supports all groups that are orking to defeat Liberals whether they be emocrat Liberals or Republican Liberals.

And now we come to what I believe is the eal reason that Mr. Moley published his diaribe against the CSA: Moley refers to the acramento Unit of the CSA as "these alleged onservatives," and then later "these dissients and destroyers in California and New 'ork," and then later . . . "I resent their eing called Conservative."

Moley, with Olympian pretensions then proeeds to lay down his guidelines as to what ictually a Conservative is. To begin with, acording to Moley's thesis, only Republicans an possibly be considered Conservative. Moey refers to Rockefeller as a "competent and prudent governor and a professed Republican." The Liberal extremist, Javits, is taken under Moley's protective wing when Moley benignly explains away Javits' voting record by saying that his (Javits') record is "more Conserva-:ive than that of 49 Democratic Senators." (The CSA Voting Index shows that during 1961, Senator Jacob Javits voted the Socialist, pro-Communist position on 14 major bills. His only "Conservative" vote was on the Feed Grains Bill!)

After paying lip service to Conservatism with lofty phrases about "free men, unfettered," Raymond Moley then gets down to what his detinition of Conservatism really is when he states, "In achieving progress, when confronted by a governing majority dedicated to 'Liberalism,' he, (the Conservative) believes in keeping things from getting worse."

Now, if that isn't a rally call to restore this country to Constitutional Government -- that we should elect Conservatives in order to "keep things from getting worse"! Members of the CSA, however, know that things will keep on "getting worse" -- and worse -- and worse, as long as we continue to elect the lesser of two evils . . the lesser always being not a genuine Conservative, but merely a 50% Conservative - 50% Liberal, or a 30% Conservative - 70% Liberal.

Raymond Moley then states that the "reactionary suicidal methods" of "these alleged Conservatives in California and New York" would, if successful, "lead us down to the tragedy of the multiple-party nations of continental Europe."

The Conservative Society of America most definitely does not favor a splinter party, or a system of multiple parties. We now have today in this country, as an increasing number of Americans are becoming aware, a oneparty system, with the policies of both the Democrat and the Republican parties being controlled by Liberal-Socialist-Internationalists. That is why the Conservative Society of America believes that the only way to break the stranglehold on this nation exercized by the Liberal-Socialists is to elect non-compromising Conservatives to Congress, regardless of party label!

IS MOLEY A CREATURE OF THE COUNCIL ON FOREIGN RELATIONS?
