On April 9th. I mailed you an  
8 Page letter from Charles C. Cox, of  
3115 W. Kiel St., Milwaukee, Wisconsin,  
53208, about the Trial of his son, Charles  
L. Cox

Please refer to my letter of Request  
for details.

At that time he was in the Port  
Washington, Jail at 129 W. Main St.,  
Port Washington, Wisconsin, 53074.

Thursday April 11th., we received  
a call saying he had been taken to  
the County Jail, at 730 Wisconsin Ave.,  
at Racine, Wisconsin, 53403.

... when we saw the 3rd. time, he has  
been transported. They had him in  
the Racine County Jail 1st, as you  
know. The Jury found him guilty even  
though another man confessed the crime.  
The Attorney appealed the case, and he  
has not been sentenced.

However, today, Easter Sunday, we  
had a <sup>private</sup> call from his Mother, Mrs. Charles  
C. Cox, stating that his Father had called  
on him at Racine County Jail, <sup>to</sup> bring <sup>to</sup> him,  
which they would not let him have. His  
Father found that he had been Beaten  
"Brutally". His face was all swollen, and  
they had kept him in a 10 x 3 ft. room,  
since he has been there. They have given  
him only 1 meal a day; have not allowed  
him to take a Bill or truss, since he  
has been there. When he told the Sheriff  
or Marshall, he was expecting a visitor,

... such, they let him out of the  
11 & 3 p.m. room, before he arrived.  
... the father reached home on  
Wednesday, he and Mrs. Cox tried to  
contact his Attorney, who was out of  
Town; Judge Reynolds who was out of  
Town; and did everything they knew, to  
have somebody, do something about the  
Brutality, to a man who has not  
even been sentenced, and whose Court-  
appointed Attorney, can never be reached!

Tomorrow, they are going to try and  
get this story to the "Evening"!

You have not Published his letter, thinking  
it was a Hoax. You have ways of checking  
such things, and we beg you to kick into  
the story, as soon as you possibly can.  
You might be surprised!
