Dear Mrs. Irving:


I have read your letter concerning the alleged brutality which occurred in the Racine County Jail. You request that this and another letter be published in The Journal.

I am afraid it is not as simple as that. We are subject to laws of libel and defamation and could be sued if the material we print is not true. I am not casting any doubt upon your veracity but we would be able to have to prove the acts of brutality in order to protect ourselves in court. I am afraid we are not in a position to do this.

If someone were to make a charge of brutality in court, then we could print this because material coming from the courts is privileged and not subject to libel laws.
