

Bullet Whizzes Past Head, DA Witness Says

DALLAS (AP) — A former Dallas County deputy sheriff who has been questioned by New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison said today that a bullet whizzed by his head yesterday.

Roger Craig said he did not report the incident to police in the belief Garrison would not want him to do so.

CRAIG, 31, A deputy for eight years, left last July to become an investigator for a bail bondsman.

The investigator said in an interview that the incident occurred at a parking lot. "The shot (it sounded like a pistol) came from behind me and went over my left ear. I could feel the wind."

Craig was questioned last week last week by Garrison, who contends there was a plot to assassinate President John F. Kennedy, who was killed in Dallas Nov. 22, 1963. The investigating Warren Commission said Lee Oswald killed the President.

CRAIG'S STORY was that immediately after the assassination he saw a man whom he identified as Oswald run from the direction of the place of the shots and jump into a slow moving station wagon. Other testimony is that Oswald walked away and boarded a city bus.

Craig said Garrison showed him pictures of the man driving the station wagon being arrested by federal agents and then releasing him.
