MISSES BU Craig Tells of Shooting

in Interview

A witness in District At-torney Jim Garrison's investigation of the Kennedy assassina-tion said Thursday that a bullet whizzed by his head Wednesday in Dallas, Tex.

in Dallas, Tex. Roger Craig, a former county deputy sheriff in Dallas, said he did not report the incident to police in the belief that Garri-son would not want him to. Craig said in an interview in Dallas that the shooting incident occurred at a parking lot. "The shot—it sounded like a pistol—came from behind me and went over my left ear," said Craig. "I could feel the wind." Craig, who left his deputy's job after eight years to become an investigator for a bail bonds-man last July, was questioned last week by Garrison. His story was that immediate-ly after President Kennedy's as-sassination he saw a man, whom he identified as Oswald, run from, the direction of the place of the shots and jump into

Craig said that Garrison show-ed him pictures of federal agents arresting and releasing the man who was driving the station wagon. ~ 5 -
