### Craig Tells of Shooting in Interview

A witness in District Attorney Jim Garrison's investigation of the Kennedy assassination said Thursday that a bullet whizzed by his head Wednesday in Dallas, Tex.

Roger Craig, a former county deputy sheriff in Dallas, said he did not report the incident to police in the belief that Garrison would not want him to.

Craig said in an interview in Dallas that the shooting incident occurred at a parking lot.

"The shot—it sounded like a pistol—came from behind me and went over my left ear," said Craig. "I could feel the wind."

Craig, who left his deputy's job after eight years to become an investigator for a bail bondsman last July, was questioned last week by Garrison.

His story was that immediately after President Kennedy's assassination he saw a man, whom he identified as Oswald, run from the direction of the place of the shots and jump into a slow-moving station wagon.

Others testified that Oswald walked away and boarded a city bus.

Craig said that Garrison showed him pictures of federal agents arresting and releasing the man who was driving the station wagon.
