## Garrison uncovers new figure in JFK assassination

NEW YORK (UPI)—GARRET GARRISON, Oct. 11 (ANS)—A former Lockheed employee today informed Garrison he was paid \$10,000 for information leading to the killing of President John F. Kennedy, and that he had been engaged in undercover work for the industrial warfare complex for years.

The information was given by James C. Crisman, 35, of New Orleans, who told Garrison on November 21, Garrison said.

Crisman, "has been engaged in undercover activity for a part of the industrial warfare complex for years. His cover is that of a 'research and person' called 'The White Phoenix'."

Garrison, press spokesman, continued. "Our information indicates that since the 1960's, Crisman has made many trips to the New Orleans and Dallas areas in connection with his undercover work. He is a 'former' employee of the Lockheed Aircraft Company,"

in the sense that he is still in the case is a 'former' employee of Lockheed Aircraft Company in Los Angeles. In intelligence terminology, this ordinarily means that the connection still exists, but that the 'former employee' has moved into an underground organization."

Asked if Crisman was involved in the killing of President Kennedy, Garrison said, "Crisman is one of the persons involved in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy." He did not elaborate on what type of a relationship it was, or with whom. It was presumed Crisman was working for the CIA, which was responsible for the killing of Kennedy, according to Garrison.

In the same interview, Garrison said his attorney, Robert W. Peeler, appealed a preliminary judicial ruling to the U.S. Supreme Court and have obtained a federal court injunction against further prosecution of Crisman.

Peeler, representative for Crisman, told UPI, "We are awaiting a final decision from the Supreme Court. We are asking that the trial be delayed until after the election of November 5, 1968."

Peeler said Crisman, "was present at the time of the killing of President Kennedy. He was murdered by elements of the industrial warfare complex working in concert with individuals in the United States Government. All the time of the killing of President Kennedy, he was in the company of Lee Harvey Oswald and the Cuban agents."

Peeler said Crisman, "had \$10,000 in cash, \$10,000 in gold and there were forced in that industry and in the
