Q. Is it true that in return for the removal from Cuba of 42 missiles and 27 Russian medium-range bombers, President Kennedy in 1962 promised Castro the U.S. would not invade Cuba and overthrow him?—Melinda Bennett, Austin, Tex.

A. Sometime ago Castro said in an interview: "One day perhaps it will be known that the U.S. made some other concessions in relation to the October crisis besides those which were made public... It was an agreement that took place by letter and through diplomatic contacts."
