## Anti-Castro Nominee Predicts a Free Cuba

NEW YORK.

Dr. Carlos Marquez Sterling, who agreed Sunday to become provisional President of an anti-Castro government reported organized within Cuba, predicted that unity would free his homeland within months.

Dr. Marquez Sterling was quoted in a statement from his New York home as having said: "A group of organizations inside Cuba have thought about me as a good alternative of all those who fight against the tyranny of Castro. But they do not constitute the majority of those who courageously combat against the opprobrious regime that destroys my fatherland."

For this reason, he added, he had conditioned his acceptance until "the existence of the great and absolute unity among all Cubans, putting aside all our differences for when we have rescued Cuba, which will be a matter of a few months once this unity has been produced."
